## Spanish ports, a very competitive option for the transport of fruit and vegetable produce

 Port traffic of fruit and vegetable products in Spain has been growing steadily since 2019

<u>05-10-2022</u> (State Ports Public Body). The State-owned ports are present at Fruit Attraction, the main trade fair for the fruit and vegetable sector in Southern Europe. With more than 7.5 million tonnes moved (including embarkations, disembarkations and transit) between January and August 2022, Spanish ports have become a very competitive option for a crucial sector in Spanish trade. According to data from the Food and Agriculture Organisation of the United Nations (FAO), Spanish imports and exports of fruit and vegetables exceeded 22 million tonnes in 2020, and Spain exported more than 17 million tonnes, making it the leading country in Europe and second in the world, behind China.

Although road transport continues to dominate Spanish exports with European countries, more than 83%, mainly with Germany, France and the Netherlands, maritime transport accounts for more than 16% of this market, which has not stopped growing since 2019, and growth expectations remain intact, given the number of connections that Spanish ports have with the main ports of these countries, as well as the diversity of services they offer.
